HRC is committed to fighting racism and racial oppression, challenging hateful policies and rhetoric and representing and advocating for the full diversity of the LGBTQ community through a range of strategies, tactics and programs.

- + **Leadership development and capacity building** for LGBTQ leaders on HBCU campuses.
- + **Creating innovative resources and reports** highlighting the unique experiences of LGBTQ communities of color.
- + **Working in coalition with civil rights allies** to fight voter suppression and white nationalism, support immigrants and refugees and more.
- + **Working to end the HIV epidemic** by advocating for culturally responsive prevention and treatment, focusing on the most impacted, including Black and Latinx gay and bisexual men and transgender women.
- + **Amplifying the voices of racially diverse young queer changemakers** through the HRC Youth Ambassador Program.
- + **Addressing bias-based bullying** in the classroom, including race-based bullying.
- + **Sharing best practices with international LGBTQ advocates** and joining together to speak out on human rights atrocities.
- + Working to **end the epidemic of fatal violence directed at transgender and non-binary people**, which disproportionately impacts transgender women of color.
